- ▶ Population 3600



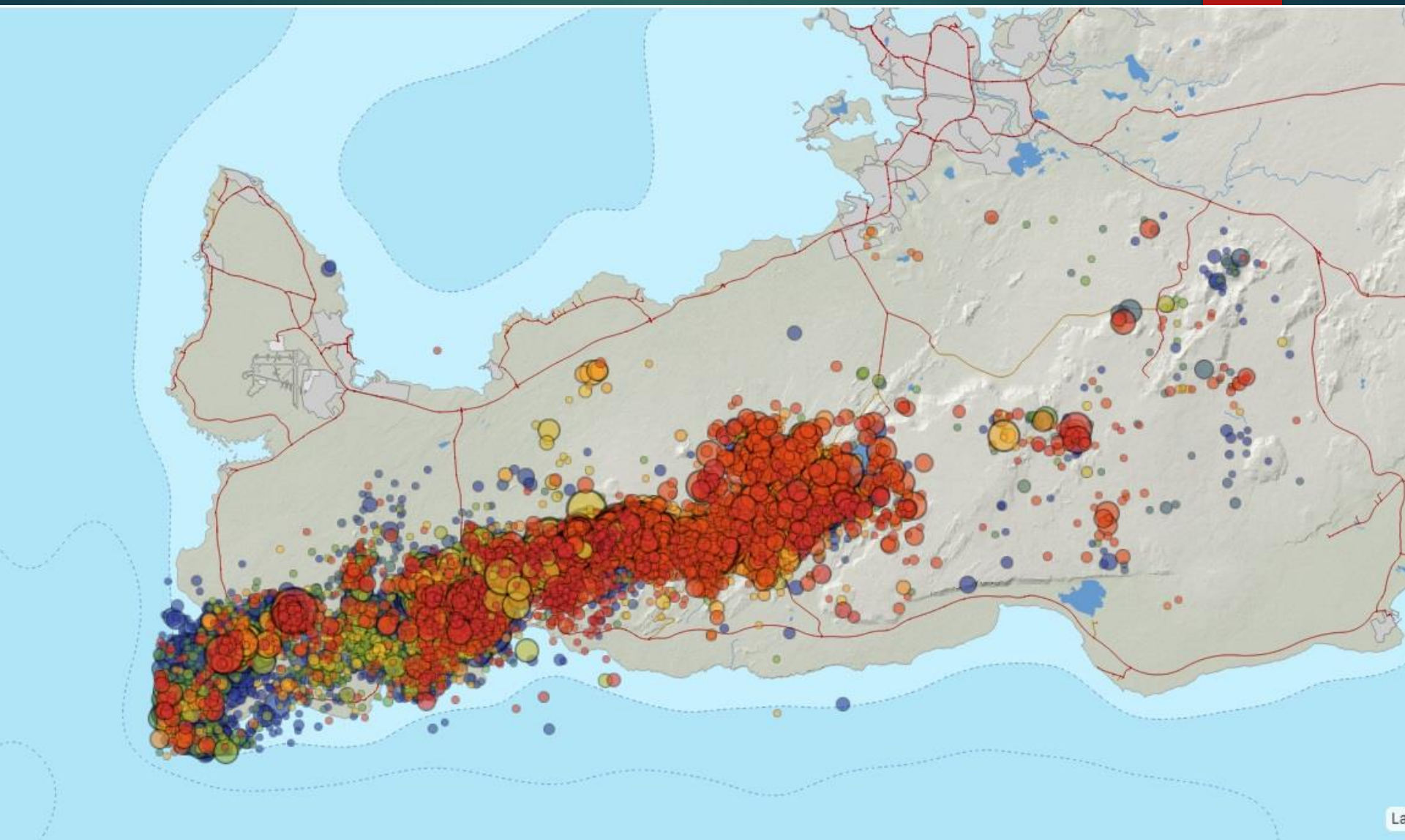


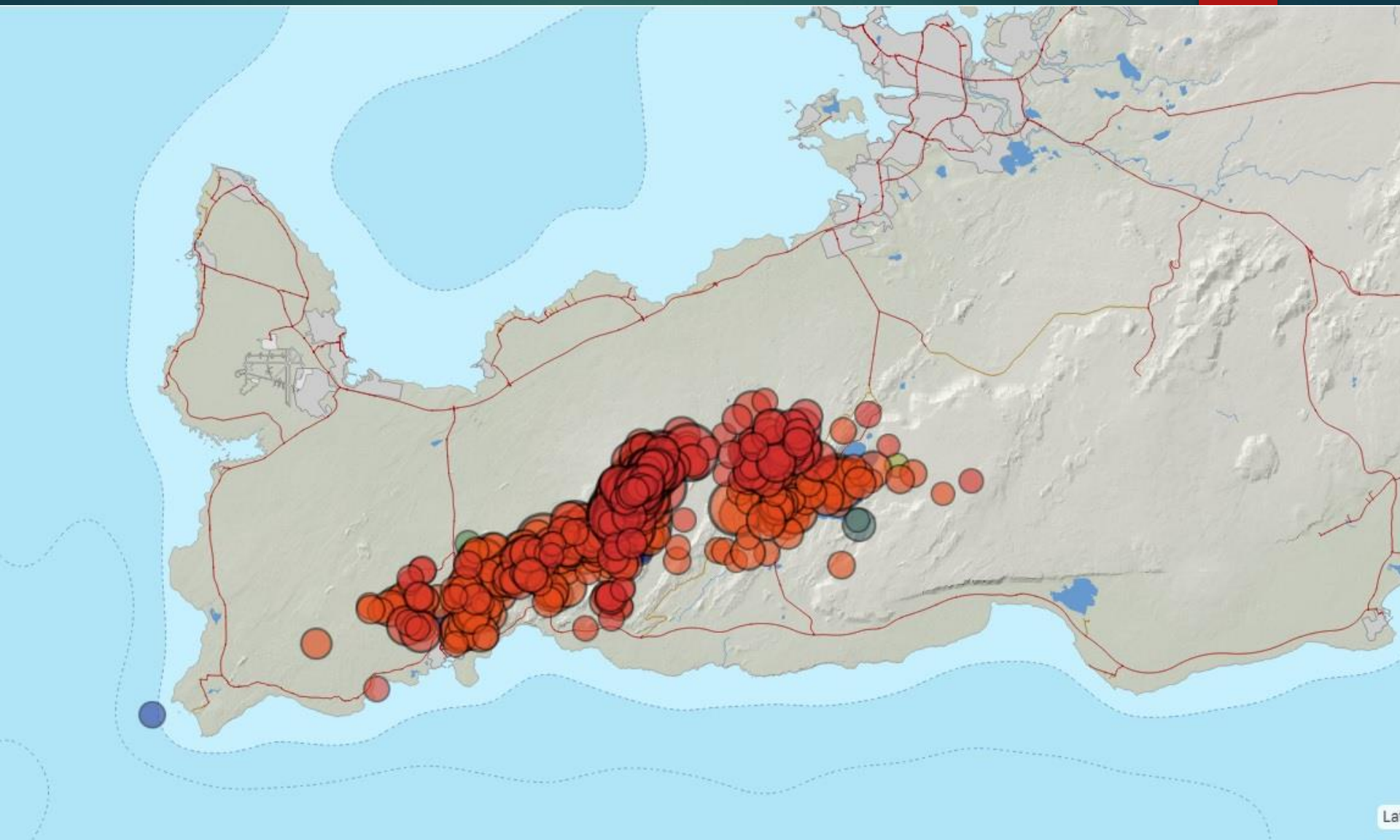

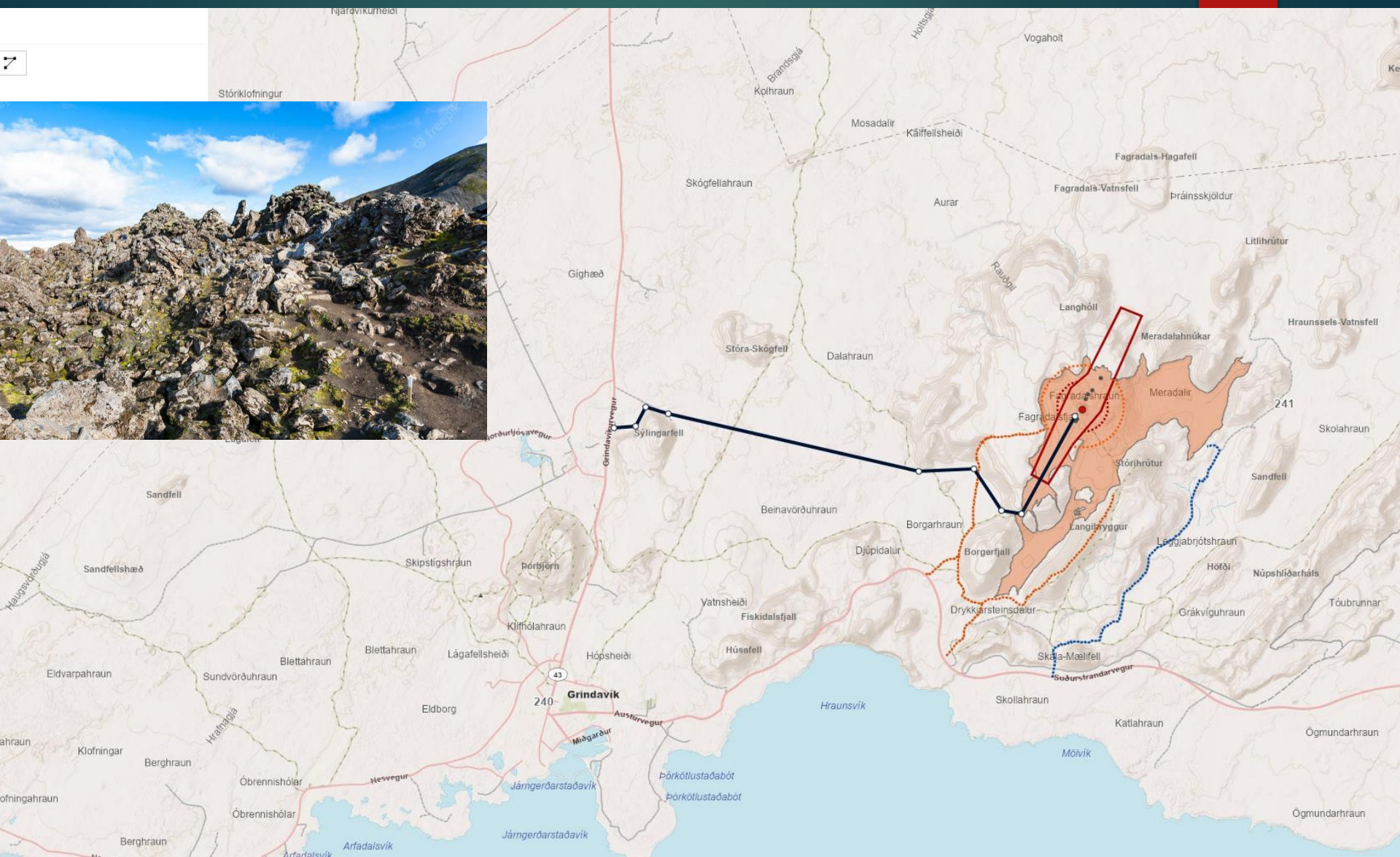




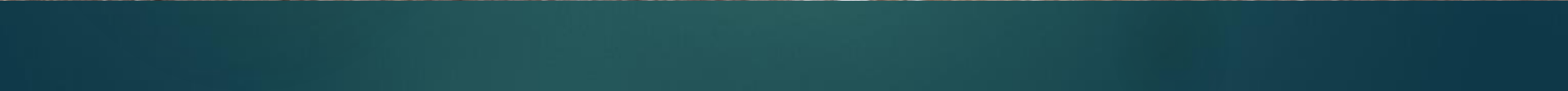




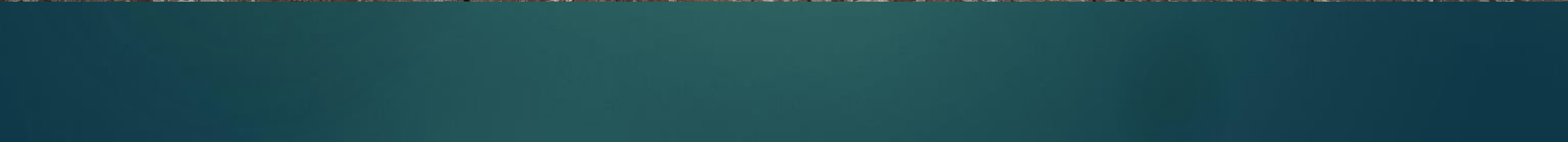






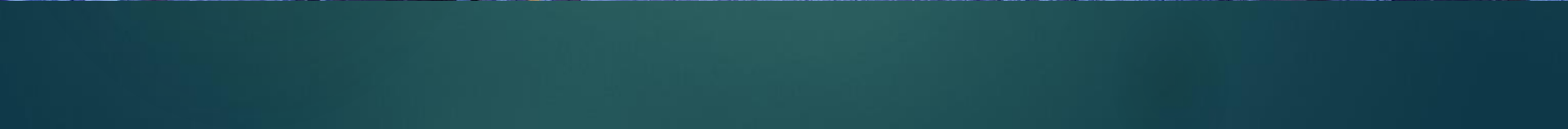
























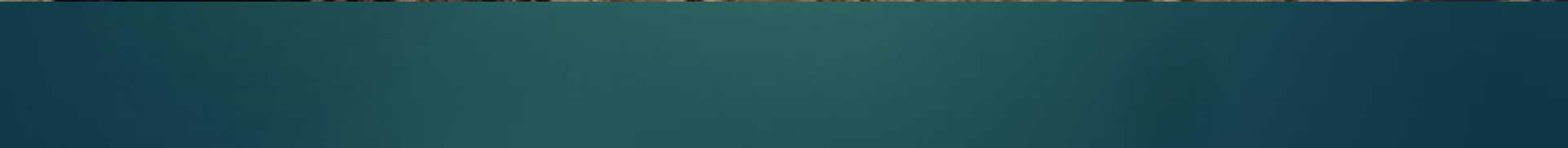


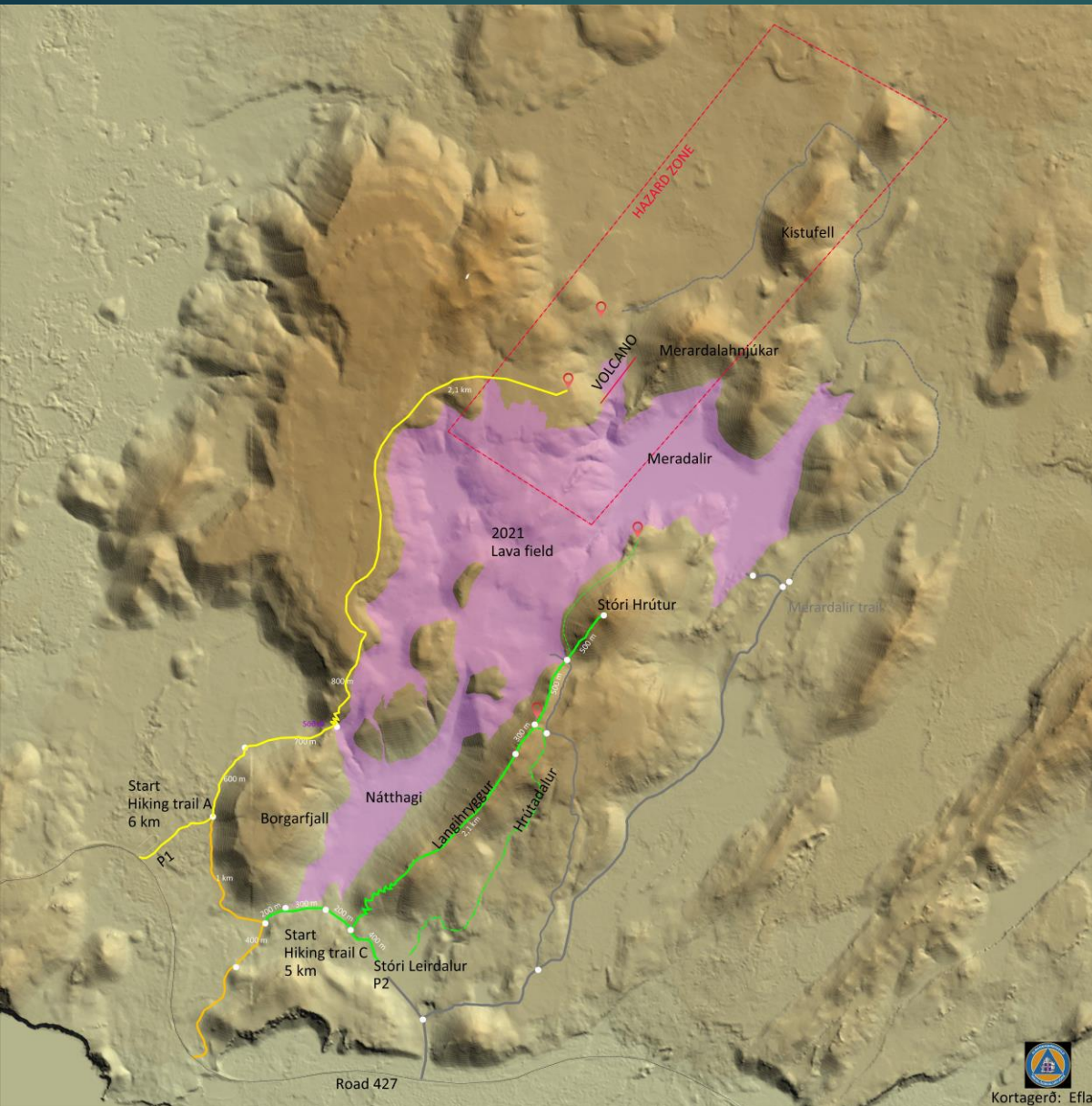













The eruption

- ▶ The first eruption started on 19th of march 2021 and ended on the 18th of september 2021
- ▶ The second eruption started 3rd of august 2022 and ended on the 21st of august 2022
